- 1. (C) Operations: Significant Activities.
 - A. Command Group:
- (1) The 6th Battalion, 27th Artillery remained assigned to II Field Force Vietnam Artillery. During this period the battalion remained under operational control of CO 23d Artillery Group. Organic batteries of this organization are assigned the following tactical missions:
- (a) Battery A General Support priority of fires to 5th ARVN Division Artillery.
- (b) Battery B General support reinforcing 1st Cavalry Division Artillery, under operational control of 2d Battalion, 12th Artillery.
- (c) Battery C General Support Reinforcing 5th ARVW Division Artillery.
- (d) Battery A, 1st Battalion, 27th Artillery General Support (priority of fires to 5th ARVN Division, under operational control of 6th Battalion, 27th Artillery).
- (e) Battery B, 2nd Battalion, 12th Artillery General Support (Reinforcing 5th ARVN Division, under operational control of 6th Battalion, 27th Artillery).

- (2) During this period, the battalicn participated in several operations and displaced units as indicated:
- (a) On 27 August 1970, first element of Battery B (2 tubes 8" and 2 tubes 175mm) departed FSB Jeannie at 1025 hours. Convoy closed Duc Fhong at 1230 hours without incident.
- (b) On 28 August 1970, second element of Eattery B departed FSB Jeannie at 1100 hours and closed Duc Phong at 1158 hours without incident.
- (c) On 25 September 1970, Battery B 2d Battalion, 12th Artillery closed Bu Dop at 1704 hours without incident. Upon closing FSB Gloria at Bu Dop, unit became CFCCN to this battalion. On the same date Battery A, 2d Battalion, 12th Artillery departed Bu Dop for Song Be and reverted to parent unit control.
 - (d) On 18 October 1970, Battery C, (4 tubes 175mm) 6th Battalien, 27th Artillery, departed "u Dop 1105 hours. Convoy closed FSS Wade at 1550 hours without incident.
 - (e) On 18 October 1970, Battery A (2 tubes 8" and 2 tubes 175mm) departed FSB Wade at 1335 hrs, en route to Bu Dop. Convoy closed NDP Elizabeth at 1726.
 - (f) On 19 October 1970, Battery & departed NDP Elizabeth at 0820 hours and closed Bu Dop at 1420 hours.
- (g) On 25 October 1970, Battery C (2 tubes 8" and 2 tubes 175mm) departed FSE Wade at 1115 hours. Convoy closed FSE Mateel at 1201 hours withort incident.
- (h) On 31 October 1970, Element of the battalion operations section departed Phu Loi at 1445 hours. Convey closed FSE Wade, Loc Minh, at 1845 hours and forward TOC was operational at 1930 hours.
- (i) The battalion meteorology section displaced from Song Be to FSB Thunder IV, an Loc on 17 September 1970. The move was completed and the section operational at 2200 hours.
- (j) On 9 Cotober 1970, at the direction of CG II Field Force Vietnam Artillery, an officer from this battalion was sent to 51st Ranger Battalion. A Recommaisance Sergeant was provided by another battalion. The team's mission was to discuss forward observer procedures and the use of artillery fires. The following subjects were discussed with the Ranger Battalion Commander and his forward observers: fuzes and their effects, appropriate fuzes for different terrain, adjustment procedures in jungle (unobserved), use of smoke and WP rounds, use of danger close, use of blocking fires, how to recon by fire, use of deftars, how to adjust gunships and TAC air, land navigation techniques, and how to observe from the air. The team spent one day and one night with the ARVN's and were to have been lifted out to another location to coordinate with the other battalion FC. The

second day the unit came under a nortar attack which: Milled 3 ARVNs and wounded 18 other personnel including the three US personnel present. All were evacuated to appropriate medical facilities.

- (3) On 091800 August 1970, the 6th Battalicn 27th Artillery assumed operational control of the An Loc Artillery Warning Control Center (AWCC). The AWCC is collecated with the CFSCC at An Loc and is under the supervision of the Battalian Liaison Officer.

C. Training

- (1) A continuous cross training program of personnel is necessary due to the constant change over of personnel and certain shortages in critical MCS's. Significant skills developed in the program are fire direction personnel, gun section chiefs, and survey personnel.
- (2) In-country schools are being utilized to upgrade assigned personnel warrant attendance at officer Fire Direction School, Enlisted Fire Direction whool, and driver training conducted at battalion level.
- (3) New arrivals in the unit have continued to receive in-country replacement training within seven days of arrival. This training is being conducted by the 1st Cavalry Division (AM) Academy at Dien Hoa and provides a firm basis for rapid adaptability of the individual to a combat environment;



D. Intelligence

- (1) During the reporting period aerial observers of this battalion 1 DW LO VR missions consisting of 142 hours which resulted in negative significant sightings. Aerial observers conducted 49 registrations during this period. The reduction of VR missions this period over the last reporting period was primarily caused by the mensoons in this area of South Vietnam.
- (2) Target surveillance credited this battalion with one confirmed among killed by artillery (KBA). Agent reports (not confirmed) indicate that artillery fires from this battalion resulted in an additional 9 enemy KBA and 6 WIA. Attacks against hard target complexes resulted in the battalion destroying 4 hootches, 19 bunkers, and 2 rice sifters. 5 hootchs are 10 bunkers were damaged by artillery fire. Numerous trails showing reversuse were uncovered and several secondary explosions resulted from antillery fire.
- (3) Survey operations during the reporting period established seven but any centers, twenty orienting stations, twenty orienting lines, one declination station, reestablished five survey control points, and surveyed locations of eight gun positions.

E. Logistics and maintenance. The battalion engaged in normal supply and maintenance activities during the reporting period. Supplies were airdalivered to Bu Dop and to Duc Phong initially. During the later part of the reporting period, class III, IV, and V supplies were delivered to Duc Phong by vehicle convoy with classI being delivered by air to both Duc Phong and Du Dop on a daily basis. Units at FSB Wade during the reporting period were resupplied overland using both organic and non-organic vehicles. classI was delivered to FSE Wade every other day while other types of supplies were delivered as needed. A particular difficulty encountered in the maintenance field was the up keep of the M548 cargo carrier with engine transfers being the chief source of downtime. At the close of the reporting period the decision was made to establish a centralized battalion PLL at Phu Loi.

F. Other:

- (1) Medical. The health of the command remained good during the reporting period. Continued emphasis on personal hygiène will be needed to hold skin disease at a reasonable level. Emphasis on venereal disease has resulted in a decline. This area will continue to be stressed. Increased attention will be paid to prevention of heat injury in the coming dry season. Drug abuse, though present in significant amounts, still does not present a deterrent to the battalion performance as a whole.
- (2) Civic Actions. Movement of Battery B 6th Battalion 27th Artil-Dary to a field location near Duc Phong has interrupted the MEDCAF activitics in the Song Be area. The Battalion Surgeon has assumed responsibility For a pediatric service at the Binh Ducng Province Hospital in Phu Cuong. By Jorks with the Vietnamese nursing staff in conjunction with the attending Flatnamese physician caring for 15 to 25 hospitalized patients daily. This resignal is well-received by the hospital staff.
- (3) Communications. On 9-10 August 1970 the battalian communications plaction installed radio and wire communications for the intillery Warning word Center at .n Loc. The equipment installed consisted of one power Fig. PF4763, two radio sets AN/VRC 46, one radio set AN/VRC 24, and one ratio set AN/FRC 25. A VHF line from a telephone set TA312 to the Hon win switchboard provides direct line communications between the An Loc 4:00 and Paris Artillery Control at Ten Son Mhut Air Base, Saigon. During the month of September 1970 the battalion metro section moved from Song be to an Loc. The communications platoon installed one and one quarter miles field wire WD-1/TT from Hon Quan Switchboard to Fire Support Dase The world IV, the new location for the met station. The wire section is furtasked with the upkeep of this land line. In October 1970, the bat-Which assumed responsibility for a part of the Phu Loi Ease perimeter de-From The battalion communications platoon relocated the sector command taloghomically with the command bunkers switchboard. In addition, a sole user line was installed from the command bunker to the battalion (Haymaker) sxitchboard. This established an alternate means of communications with the Base Defense Command Post.
